AN ACT relative to naming a highway or bridge in honor of the late Lance Corporal Gregory A. Posey, United States Marine Corps.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, it is the intent of this General Assembly to name an appropriate bridge on State Highway 41A in Franklin County to honor the memory of Lance Corporal (LCpl) Gregory A. Posey, United States Marine Corps, a Marine soldier who gave his life while serving in the War on Terror.

SECTION 2. The department of transportation shall designate bridge number 26SR0160011 as bearing the honorable LCpl Gregory A. Posey's name.

SECTION 3. The department of transportation shall erect suitable signs or affix suitable markers designating the selected bridge as the "LCpl Gregory A. Posey Memorial Bridge". The cost of such signage shall be funded in accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated, § 54-1-133.

SECTION 4. The erection of such signs shall be within the guidelines prescribed by the *Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices*.

SECTION 5. This act shall become operative only if the federal highway administrator advises the commissioner of transportation in writing that the provisions of this act shall not render Tennessee in violation of federal laws and regulations and subject to penalties prescribed therein.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
