AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4, Chapter 56, Part 1 and Title 12, Chapter 4, relative to state procurement.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

- SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-56-104(d)(1), is amended, effective April 1, 2012, by inserting the word "chief" immediately preceding the language "procurement officer".
- SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-56-104(e)(2), is amended, effective April 1, 2012, by deleting the word "officer" and by substituting instead the word "office".
- SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-56-104(e)(4), is amended, effective April 1, 2012, by inserting the word "chief" immediately preceding the language "procurement officer".
- SECTION 4. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-56-104(f), is amended, effective April 1, 2012, by deleting the language "chief procurement office" and by substituting instead the language "procurement office".
- SECTION 5. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-56-105(2), is amended by deleting the date "October 1, 2011" and by substituting instead the date "April 1, 2012".
- SECTION 6. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-56-105(6), is amended, effective April 1, 2012, by inserting the word "chief" immediately preceding the language "procurement officer".
- SECTION 7. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-56-106(e)(3), is amended, effective April 1, 2012, by deleting the language "chief procurement office" and by substituting instead the language "procurement office".
- SECTION 8. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 12-4-124(d), is amended, effective April 1, 2012, by deleting the language "chief procurement officer" and substituting instead "procurement commission".

SECTION 9. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
