V & E Greenline, the University of Memphis Alumni, Pi Alpha, and the Shelby County Democratic Party, and she is a Lifetime Member of the NAACP; and

WHEREAS, no stranger to awards and accolades, Representative Richardson is the recipient of the YWCA Leadership Award, Pi Alpha Alpha Public Administration Honorary Alumni distinction, the Dorthea Dix Mental Health Professional of the Year Award, the Sierra Club Award, and the Tennessee Transgender Political Coalition Award and has been recognized by the Tennessee Alliance for the Mentally Ill; and
