A RESOLUTION to honor and commend the Shelby County 4-H Forestry Team upon winning the 33rd Annual National 4-H Forestry Invitational.

WHEREAS, it is fitting that this General Assembly should pay tribute to those outstanding young Tennesseans who have evidenced an ongoing commitment to healthy forests and a vibrant forest products industry for future generations; and

WHEREAS, the Shelby County 4-H Forestry Team recently emerged victorious from the 33rd Annual National 4-H Forestry Invitational, the Super Bowl of 4-H Forestry, to claim the title of National Champions; and

WHEREAS, having already claimed the Tennessee 4-H Forestry Championship, the Shelby County squad next traveled to Weston, West Virginia, to claim the Volunteer State's first national championship since 1993; and

WHEREAS, Shelby County and Tennessee were represented by erudite scholars and fierce competitors at the Invitational, all of whom are home-schooled; the Shelby County 4-H Forestry Team includes Hayden Quick of Rosemark, Michael Crenshaw of Rosemark, Amber Joy Cleveland of Germantown, and Emma Osborn of Somerville; and

WHEREAS, competing in both overall team and individual categories, Tennessee also captured the top individual score in addition to winning the team championship; and

WHEREAS, Michael Crenshaw took first place in the individual competition with a 509.5 score out of a possible 550; and

WHEREAS, Amber Cleveland took fourth place (474) and Hayden Quick claimed fifth place (470) in the individual competition; and

WHEREAS, the Shelby County team benefited greatly from the leadership, instruction, and example of Coach Weida Ringley and Assistant Coach Gayle Quick; and

WHEREAS, these remarkable young people have combined their diverse skills and worked together to strengthen their bond and win a prestigious national championship, and they should be specially honored; now, therefore,
