A RESOLUTION to honor Hazel Moore upon her receipt of the Legends Award from the Women's Foundation for a Greater Memphis.

WHEREAS, there remains a need for organizations to remain committed to the prosperity and well being of women and families in their communities; and

WHEREAS, since 1995, the Women's Foundation for a Greater Memphis has been one such organization, and has had as its mission "to encourage philanthropy and foster leadership among women and support programs that enable women and children to reach their full potential"; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to fund its many programs and grant-making initiatives, the Women's Foundation for a Greater Memphis has held a number of events each spring highlighting the accomplishments of outstanding Memphis women whose contributions have touched the lives of countless Mid-South citizens; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Moore now serves as a member of the Methodist South Healthcare Community Board, as president of the Community Relations Council Board of the Dr. Benjamin Hooks Job Corps Center, as a member of the Remington College Memphis Campus Advisory Board, and also on the Mayor's Advisory Board on Education; and

WHEREAS, affectionately known as "The Mayor of Whitehaven," Mrs. Moore has operated Hazel's Hair Fashions for many years, affording young men and women livelihoods and careers in the hair care industry; now, therefore,
