HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 763

A RESOLUTION to honor the Clarksville-Montgomery County Education Foundation and the Clarksville-Montgomery County School District on the 25th anniversary of their Academic Awards Student Recognition Program.

WHEREAS, the Academic Awards Student Recognition Program was established to serve as a system-wide academic awards banquet to honor the high achievements of Clarksville-Montgomery County sophomores, juniors, and seniors; and

WHEREAS, the first annual Academic Awards Banquet was held twenty-five years ago at the request of Dr. Charles Lindsey, former superintendent of Clarksville-Montgomery County Schools, on May 23, 1990, honoring 187 recipients; and

WHEREAS, the selection criteria for students has remained the same for twenty-five years, requiring all student recipients to achieve a ninety-three grade average for two consecutive semesters with no one grade lower than an eighty-five in any individual subject; and

WHEREAS, the Academic Awards Banquet is noted as one of a kind in Tennessee with the first featured speaker being Governor Ned McWherter in 1990; and

WHEREAS, the program has been underwritten by the Clarksville community and supporters of public education for twenty-five years; they contributed \$25,000 to make the first annual Academic Awards Banquet a success; and

WHEREAS, twenty-year sponsors include Rufus Johnson and Associates, Jack B. Turner and Associates, Gannett-*The Leaf Chronicle*, Jostens Publishing & Printing, and The Trane Company; and




BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an appropriate copy of this resolution be prepared for presentation with this final clause omitted from such copy.
