## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1004

A RESOLUTION to honor Fui Vakapuna and welcome him to Tennessee.

WHEREAS, this General Assembly takes great pleasure in warmly welcoming a gentleman who excelled in football at both the collegiate and professional levels while also performing public service in his community; and

WHEREAS, this gentleman is Fui Vakapuna, a former collegiate fullback at Brigham Young University (BYU) and a former NFL player; and

WHEREAS, the oldest of the eight children born to Uina and Semisi Vakapuna, Fui Vakapuna is the first member from either side of his family to graduate from college; and

WHEREAS, he began playing football at the tender age of seven and eventually progressed to become a four-year letterman in football at Salt Lake City's East High School, for which he also ran hurdles; and

WHEREAS, during his high school career, Fui also played for the Highland Rugby club that won two national titles; he had the honor of playing alongside future NFL players Haloti Ngata and Stewart Bradley and earned USA National MVP honors for high school rugby as a senior; and

WHEREAS, Fui was offered a scholarship to attend BYU as a high school junior; he was redshirted at BYU for the 2002 season and played one season before departing for Carlsbad, California, to participate in a Latter Day Saints church mission; and

WHEREAS, upon returning to BYU, Fui excelled for three seasons as a hard-hitting fullback who scored 17 total touchdowns, but perhaps even more impressive are the respect and admiration he earned from his teammates and coaches for his work ethic; and

WHEREAS, as a junior, he received the Leon White Award for Unselfish Devotion, and he was honored with the Robbie Bosco Award for Determination in his senior year; and

WHEREAS, in 2009, Fui was selected in the 7th round of the NFL draft by the Cincinnati Bengals and played for two seasons with the team; and

WHEREAS, he was subsequently signed by the Indianapolis Colts and then the New York Jets before retiring from the NFL in 2012; and

WHEREAS, Fui experienced an even greater thrill than the NFL draft in 2009, when he married his beautiful wife, Leone; they now have a one-year-old daughter named Maiana; and

WHEREAS, both during and after his football career, Fui gave back to the Salt Lake community by volunteering at ScenicView Academy, a school that helps adults with disabilities learn to live independent lives; and

WHEREAS, in July 2013, Fui began a new and exciting career at his alma mater by serving as assistant to the athletic director at BYU; and

WHEREAS, on April 22, 2014, Fui Vakapuna is representing the BYU Alumni Association at a golfing event in Chattanooga; now, therefore,


