WHEREAS, as Ms. Sennel approaches her eleventh decade, she is still an active and productive member of society, participating in various civic and community events, as her health permits; and


WHEREAS, we wish to grasp this golden opportunity to specially recognize one of Tennessee's most outstanding citizens on this very special occasion; now, therefore,
