WHEREAS, named to the 2014 list of Most Admired CEOs in the Nashville area by the *Nashville Business Journal*, George Uribe is the co-founder of New York Newsmakers, a networking organization of journalists, producers, bookers, and public relations professionals in New York City, and he co-founded the Miami Media Mixer and the Music City Media Mixer; and

WHEREAS, he also served in various public affairs positions for the United States Army Reserve, including the 77th Regional Support Command and the 77th Regional Readiness Command, where he was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal for his service to the "Statue of Liberty Command" from 2001 to 2006; and

WHEREAS, a graduate of North Carolina State University and George Washington University, Mr. Uribe serves on the board of directors of Rocketown, a place for underprivileged children in Nashville, and is a former member of the board of governors for the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences, Mid-South chapter; and

WHEREAS, his many professional and community achievements aside, George Uribe is perhaps most grateful for the love and support of his wife, Margaret Binford Uribe, and their two daughters, Lauren Randall Uribe and Charlotte Teresa Uribe; and

WHEREAS, George Uribe epitomizes the spirit and commitment that are characteristic of a true Tennessean; and


WHEREAS, the members of this legislative body find it appropriate to acknowledge and applaud Mr. Uribe for his professional excellence; now, therefore,
