WHEREAS, Marcus's noteworthy achievement is a tremendous source of pride for his family, his school, and his community; and


WHEREAS, Marcus Prescott's dedication to excellence is clearly deserving of the respect, admiration, and commendation of this legislative body; now, therefore,
