A RESOLUTION to recognize Timothy Heimbach on becoming an Eagle Scout.

WHEREAS, demonstrating the tenets of the Scout Law in being trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent, Timothy displays the principles of the Scout Promise in duty to God and country by helping others, being physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight; and

WHEREAS, Timothy's Eagle project greatly contributed to the betterment of his community and reflected the true spirit of Volunteerism; and

WHEREAS, for his Eagle Scout project, Timothy built a stage for his church, The Grace Place in Hermitage, to celebrate its 100th anniversary in September 2014. The church plans to use the stage for many years to come as it moves into its next 100 years of service; and

WHEREAS, dedicated to community service, Timothy participates monthly with a local food pantry and has traveled on several mission trips with his church; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that we should recognize Timothy as one of the most outstanding young people in our State; now, therefore,
