SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 567

- A RESOLUTION to confirm the appointment of Bill Carey to the education standards recommendation committee for social studies.
- WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-1-313, requires the state board of education to adopt "[new] sets of standards in science and social studies that fit the needs of Tennessee students in kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12)"; and
- WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-1-310(a), requires that such standards "be adopted through an open, transparent process that allows all Tennesseans an opportunity to participate ... and fully implemented in Tennessee public schools in the 2017-2018 school year"; and
- WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-1-313, provides for the creation of the standards recommendation committee for science and social studies to facilitate such process; and
- WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-1-313, further provides that the "standards recommendation committee [be] appointed in the same manner as the standards recommendation committee created in § 49-1-312"; and
- WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-1-312(a), provides that the speaker of the senate shall appoint three (3) members to the standards recommendation committee; and
- WHEREAS, Lt. Governor Ron Ramsey, Speaker of the Senate, has appointed Bill Carey to serve on such committee; and
- WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-1-312(b), provides that all appointments to the committee "shall be subject to confirmation by the senate and the house of representatives"; now, therefore,
- BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, that we confirm the appointment of Bill Carey to the education standards recommendation committee for social studies.
