AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 57, relative to licenses issued by the alcoholic beverage commission.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-3-208, is amended by redesignating subdivisions (b)(1)-(3) as subdivisions (b)(1)(A)-(C) and by adding the following language as subdivision (b)(2):

(2) Each applicant or officer identified in subdivision (b)(1)(A) must obtain and submit with the certificate a local and national criminal history record obtained from a third party using a multistate criminal records locator or other similar commercial nationwide database with validation. A criminal history record that indicates that the applicant or officer has not been convicted of a felony within the immediately preceding ten-year period serves as proof satisfactory that the applicant or officer has complied with subdivision (b)(1)(A).

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-3-806, is amended by redesignating subdivisions (b)(1) and (b)(2) as subdivisions (b)(1)(A) and (b)(1)(B) and by adding the following language as subdivision (b)(2):

(2) Each applicant or officer identified in subdivision (b)(1)(A) must obtain and submit with the certificate a local and national criminal history record obtained from a third party using a multistate criminal records locator or other similar commercial nationwide database with validation. A criminal history record that indicates that the applicant or officer has not been convicted of a felony within the immediately preceding ten-year period serves as proof satisfactory that the applicant or officer has complied with subdivision (b)(1)(A).

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017, the public welfare requiring it.
