AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 68, Chapter 140, relative to emergency medical services.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-140-311, is amended by adding the following as a new subsection:

Any person subject to regulation under this part must notify the Tennessee emergency medical services board of all convictions and pending charges, including arrests, citations for reckless driving under § 55-10-205, and indictments, for commission of a felony or misdemeanor in any jurisdiction within ten (10) business days of the occurrence of such actions. This subsection shall apply to persons whose licenses are active, inactive, or suspended on the date of the conviction or the date the charges were filed. Failure to timely notify the Tennessee emergency medical services board of the occurrence of such actions shall result in the suspension of active and inactive licenses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018, and shall apply to all convictions and charges filed against persons subject to the requirements of this act on and after July 1, 2018, the public welfare requiring it.
