WHEREAS, a native of Memphis, Bev Johnson graduated from Rust College in 1975 with a Bachelor of Arts in English Literature, and she earned a Master of Science in Educational/Media Technology from Jackson State University in Jackson, Mississippi, in 1979; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Johnson has always placed high value on community service, and she has volunteered countless hours in support of the YWCA's Women's Abuse Shelter and the United Negro College Fund; and

WHEREAS, perhaps her greatest accomplishments have come as a member of the Board of Directors for the Memphis Chapter of Planned Parenthood, the NAACP, the National Coalition of Black Programmers, and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority; and

WHEREAS, she has also assumed various professional leadership roles in educational training in the Memphis area; she teaches radio at Rust College and public speaking at Southwest Community College; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Johnson is a devout Christian and evinces her strong belief in the Lord through her membership at Mt. Pisgah C.M.E. Church; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of her thirty years of superlative programming, it is certainly appropriate that the members of this General Assembly should honor Bev Johnson, host and
