HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 759

A RESOLUTION to confirm the appointment of Neel Durbin of Dyersburg to the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201, provides for the creation of the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201(a)(1)(A), provides that the Speaker of the Senate shall appoint one member from each grand division of the State to the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201(b)(1)(B), provides that one member from each grand division of the State be a director of a city school system or special school district; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Governor Randy McNally, Speaker of the Senate, acting pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201(a)(1)(A), has appointed Neel Durbin of Dyersburg as a member representing West Tennessee on the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission for a term that will expire on December 31, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Neel Durbin is the Director of Schools for Dyersburg City Schools and has rendered sterling service with the school system for a number of years; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201(d)(1), provides that each member, prior to beginning a term of office, shall be confirmed by joint resolution of the General Assembly; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED TENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE CONCURRING, that we hereby confirm the appointment of Neel Durbin to the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission for a term that will expire on December 31, 2018.
