WHEREAS, known as "Junior," Mr. Terry was an exemplary public servant and consummate professional who worked assiduously to improve the quality of life for his fellow citizens in numerous capacities; and

WHEREAS, Junior Terry was born on April 22, 1951, in Detroit, Michigan, to Gertrude Marcum Terry and James Esker "Eck" Terry; and

WHEREAS, a lifelong farmer, Junior Terry discovered his passion for farming as a young boy growing up on his grandparents' farm; over the years, he learned many skills dealing with livestock, equipment, and the land itself, eventually parlaying them into a career as a successful farmer; and

WHEREAS, valued as an expert in his vocation, Mr. Terry served on several advisory boards during his career, including the Farm Bureau Board, Scott-Morgan Farmer's Cooperative Board, and the Scott Water and Conservation Board, and was named Farmer of the Year in 1995; and

WHEREAS, Junior Terry was loved by all who knew him, as he extended kindness and compassion to everyone he met; he often assisted other friends and families in maintaining their fields and gardens and caring for their livestock; and

WHEREAS, a driven, hardworking individual and first-class businessman, Mr. Terry also owned his own company, Terry Insulation, and drove a school bus for twenty-two years; and

WHEREAS, Junior Terry was an active and devout member of Pine Creek United Baptist Church for fifty-three years, serving faithfully in many capacities, including as a deacon and treasurer; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Terry was also deeply devoted to his family, and he always endeavored to remain true to family values of the highest order; and

WHEREAS, he is survived by his beloved wife and best friend of forty-four years, Katherine "Kat" Terry; sons, Jared Terry and Justin Terry; and grandchildren, Hailey Kendall Terry, Katherine Terry, Ezra Terry, Hughston Terry, and Deegun Terry; and

WHEREAS, he is further survived by his mother; siblings, Danny Ray "DT" Terry, Linda Malone, Debbie Anderson, and Lisa Carson; sister-in-law, Donna Stephens; brother-in-law Bobby Blevins; special friends, Donnie Burke and Jerry Marcum; and a host of nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, and friends; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we express our sympathy and offer our condolences to the family of Mr. Terry.


