A RESOLUTION to congratulate the staff and volunteers of the 2017 Wilson County Fair upon being named the 2017 State Champion Fair in the Triple A division by the Tennessee Association of Fairs.

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly should pay tribute to those events that promote local business, entertain and educate our citizens, and celebrate the history and culture of the great State of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 Wilson County Fair is one such estimable event, which recently received the prestigious honor of being named the State Champion Fair in the Triple A division by the Tennessee Association of Fairs; and

WHEREAS, since its inception more than thirty years ago, the Wilson County Fair Board has held as its primary goal the creation and cultivation of a county fair that entertains and educates the young and old while offering a host of exhibitions and performances that draw from the whole spectrum of life in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 Wilson County Fair took place August 18–26, 2017, and its theme was the "Year of the Sunflower," in which all of its exhibits and activities were to showcase the best of Wilson County and to remind the attendees of who is responsible for supplying food and clothing in the stores that we provide our families every day; and

WHEREAS, the Wilson County Fair now utilizes the new 78,000-square-foot Wilson County Expo Center at the James E. Ward Agricultural Center, which was a twenty-year dream of former longtime Wilson Fair president the late Hale Moss and the many volunteers working the fair; and

WHEREAS, with the Wilson County Expo Center, a crowd of 488,299 people enjoyed nine days of activities, featuring 150 events with more than 14,000 exhibits, which included fair pageants, a God and Country Celebration, quilting, canning, baking, fine arts, photography, stained glass, school exhibits, fruits and vegetables, live music, competitive exhibits, Hometown USA, and, of course, carnival rides; and

WHEREAS, guests also enjoyed a collection of more than fifty buildings exhibiting Tennessee history and lore called Fiddlers Grove, including the new addition of the Moss Feed Store, which was constructed in 2017 by the Moss Family and the Fair Board in memory of Mr. Moss; and

WHEREAS, this unparalleled circus of delight is currently guided by President Randall Clemons, who was recently appointed to the position following the death of Hale Moss; Mr. Clemons previously served the Wilson Fair as treasurer for thirty-eight years; and

WHEREAS, the Wilson Fair greatly benefited from the stalwart leadership and vision of the Wilson County Fair Board officers, including Vice President Jimmy Comer, Fair Manager Helen McPeak, Treasurer Lynette Taylor, and Secretary Karen Johnson, with additional support
