A RESOLUTION to honor the memory of Joe Clyde Daniels.

WHEREAS, Joe Daniels has been freed from the daily cares and woes of life on this earth to enjoy a better existence on a higher plane, yet he still lives on in our hearts and minds; now, therefore,
