WHEREAS, Phyllis Naylor will be fondly remembered by her loving husband, Bobby Naylor; her children, Todd Naylor and Tammy Foote; her sisters, Gene Shearon and Vonda Siler; her grandchildren, Matt Harris, John Tyler Harris, and Drew Naylor; and her great-grandchild, Siler Jack Harris; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly should pause to remember the bountiful life of this exceptional public servant and human being; now, therefore,



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we express our sympathy and offer our condolences to the family of Mrs. Naylor.


