A RESOLUTION to honor the memory of Dwana Pusser Garrison.

WHEREAS, Dwana Garrison was an exemplary public servant and consummate professional who worked assiduously to improve the quality of life for her fellow citizens in numerous capacities; and

WHEREAS, she will be fondly remembered by her loving husband, Jamie Garrison; her daughters, Atoyia Barnes and Madison Garrison; her stepdaughter, Tara Garrison; her grandchildren, Abby Moffett, Hayse Barnes, Dani Beth Moffett, and Jack Houston Barnes; her half-brother, Mike Vance; and a host of extended family and friends; and

WHEREAS, Dwana Garrison was preceded in death by her parents and her half-sister, Diane Vance Mullins; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we express our sympathy and offer our condolences to the family of Mrs. Garrison.


