WHEREAS, one such individual is Justin J. Pearson of Memphis, founder of Camp Hope Memphis, who has dedicated himself to serving disadvantaged students in the Memphis area, providing them with access to a better future; and

WHEREAS, Camp Hope Memphis is a summer program that serves communities with high rates of poverty and violence; since 2013, the program has worked with more than 100 students in North and South Memphis; and

WHEREAS, in addition to focusing on academic and career readiness, Camp Hope Memphis strives to help students become social advocates who invest in their communities; students who participate in the program not only map out trajectories toward attending college or embarking on a career, they create actionable plans to improve their communities, meet with elected officials, and connect virtually with citizens from various countries around the world; and

WHEREAS, drawing on his passion for government, law, and education, Mr. Pearson devoted himself to spearheading Camp Hope Memphis, attracting many viable partners in the process; the program currently enjoys partnerships with the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation, the Boys & Girls Clubs of America, Shelby County schools, Bowdoin's McKinley Family, Nucor Steel Corporation-Memphis, and Mr. Pearson's alma mater, Mitchell High School; and

WHEREAS, Justin Pearson is relentless in his belief that all people deserve a fair opportunity to achieve their dreams, a belief that was fostered by his parents, Kimberly and Jason Pearson, Sr., who raised five sons up from poverty; and

WHEREAS, the impact that Mr. Pearson has had on the youth in his community is a testament to what compassion in action can accomplish, and it is fitting that he be recognized for his good works; now, therefore,
