WHEREAS, Bill Mueller was a man of devout faith and a member of First United Methodist Church of Maryville; he served the church in various capacities, working at the Welcome Table, assisting with Celebrate Recovery, and washing dishes after meals; and

WHEREAS, he served on various mission trips as a member of the church, including a trip to the Dominican Republic and ten trips to New Orleans, Louisiana, after Hurricane Katrina; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mueller was also deeply devoted to his family, and he always endeavored to remain true to family values of the highest order; and

WHEREAS, left to cherish his memory are his son and daughter-in-law, Jeff and Jessica Mueller; daughters and sons-in-law, Julie and Rodney Nelson and Jayne and Mike Gallegos; grandchildren, Leslie Mueller, Henry Mueller, Jenica Nelson, Reece Nelson, Tory Nelson, Maddie Gallegos, Frannie Gallegos, Jake Gallegos, and Georgie Gallegos; and many special friends at Blount County Habitat for Humanity and First United Methodist Church of Maryville; and

WHEREAS, he was preceded in death by his wife, Donna L. Mueller; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mueller was a community leader known for his integrity and compassionate service, a good man most worthy of emulation; and
