WHEREAS, in 2002, Mr. Wharton was honored to be elected as the first African-American mayor of Shelby County, in which position he earned the respect of his community for his hard work and dedication; he went on to serve as mayor of Memphis from 2009 to 2015; and


WHEREAS, A C Wharton is an exemplary individual; his commitment to excellence and community service is representative of the Volunteer State, and he should be specially recognized; now, therefore,
