## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 188

A RESOLUTION to honor and commend Lindsey Anderson for her distinguished service to the youth of Tennessee.

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly should pause to specially recognize those outstanding educators who have devoted their careers to providing the highest quality education for Tennessee's students; and

WHEREAS, Lindsey Anderson is one such estimable educator, who has distinguished herself as a professional of the greatest dedication, ability, and integrity; and

WHEREAS, an employee of Williamson County Schools, Ms. Anderson renders sterling service as the library media specialist at Woodland Middle School in Brentwood; and

WHEREAS, she is an extremely talented and compassionate educator who works assiduously to motivate her students to reach their full potential, both as scholars and as citizens; and

WHEREAS, for the last three years, Lindsey Anderson has led a peer-to-peer reading program, Read2Me, that connects students at her school with their reading buddies at Ida B. Wells Elementary School in Nashville; and

WHEREAS, as the middle school students read to the elementary students each week, the older students have seen an improvement in their reading fluency and their ability to check for understanding as they quiz the elementary students on the books they are reading; the older students take pride in selecting the books to be read and make Quizlets that include sight words and sentences for their reading buddy to read; and

WHEREAS, the elementary students read books that relate directly to their curriculum, and their sight word recognition and reading abilities have improved as they read a variety of books each week for fifteen to twenty-five minutes with their reading buddy; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the weekly reading sessions, the students at Woodland Middle School have sponsored book drives and supplied new books for their book buddies; they have made in-person field trips to Ida B. Wells Elementary School and coauthored stories with their buddies; and

WHEREAS, Lindsey Anderson and leaders at Woodland Middle School have also included the elementary students in a virtual conversation with a *New York Times* best-selling author; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Anderson is an inspiration to her colleagues and students alike, and her friendship and counsel are highly valued by those who are fortunate to know her; and




BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an appropriate copy of this resolution be prepared for presentation with this final clause omitted from such copy.
