## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 209

A RESOLUTION to confirm the appointment of Decosta Jenkins to the board of trustees of the University of Tennessee.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-9-201, provides for the governance of the University of Tennessee by the board of trustees; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-9-202, provides that the governor shall appoint ten members to the board of trustees of the University of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Governor Bill Haslam has appointed Decosta Jenkins of Nashville to the board of trustees of the University of Tennessee to a term that commences July 1, 2018, and expires June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Jenkins is the president and chief executive officer of Nashville Electric Service (NES), one of the largest public utilities in the country; and

WHEREAS, prior to his current role, Mr. Jenkins served as the senior vice president and chief financial officer for NES and, before joining the company, was a certified public accountant with Deloitte; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Jenkins earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Jenkins brings strong financial experience and a commitment to service to the board of trustees; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-9-202, provides that each member appointed by the governor to the board of trustees of the University of Tennessee shall be confirmed by the General Assembly; now, therefore,


