WHEREAS, one such noteworthy person is Richard W. Smith, the regional president of the Americas, which includes the domestic United States, Canada, Latin America, and the Caribbean, and executive vice president of Global Support for FedEx Express; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Smith began his illustrious career with FedEx in 2005 and has served this esteemed company in numerous capacities, including regional president for FedEx Express, U.S. Domestic; president and CEO of FedEx Logistics; and various leadership positions in life sciences, healthcare, and customer solutions, including service as vice president of global trade services and managing director of life sciences and specialty services; and

WHEREAS, a native of Memphis, Mr. Smith earned his undergraduate degree from George Washington University and his Juris Doctor from the University of Mississippi School of Law; and

WHEREAS, an active part of his community, Mr. Smith is the immediate past chairman of the Greater Memphis Chamber of Commerce and serves on its Chairman's Circle Board; he is a member of Launch Tennessee, the Coalition of Services Industries, and Epicenter Memphis; and


