WHEREAS, Officer Sam Bady of the Brentwood Police Department recently announced his much-deserved retirement; and

WHEREAS, Officer Bady began his illustrious career in law enforcement twenty-five years ago, and, since 1999, he has served in the crime prevention division as a beloved Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) officer at elementary, middle, and high schools in Brentwood; his role is invaluable, as Brentwood is the only municipality in Tennessee that still teaches CORE to the elementary students and D.A.R.E. to middle and high school students; and

WHEREAS, Officer Bady exhibits tireless work ethic; in addition to his service as a D.A.R.E. officer, he has worked with children on the weekends in various capacities, including reading to them at the John P. Holt Brentwood Library and speaking as a community hero to Scouts from Kenrose and Jordan elementary schools; and

WHEREAS, he has been an incredible ambassador for the Brentwood Police Department, connecting with generations of children in Brentwood schools and beyond; and

WHEREAS, not only has Officer Bady served the Brentwood Police Department with acumen and alacrity, he has worked as a safety officer at Brentwood United Methodist Church (BUMC) for seventeen years; and

WHEREAS, he is most grateful for the love and companionship he shares with his wife, Deborah, whom he married in the chapel at BUMC; and

WHEREAS, although he is closing a chapter with his retirement from the Brentwood Police Department, Officer Bady hopes to continue serving in a protective capacity; and

WHEREAS, Officer Bady has honorably served the City of Brentwood for twenty-five years, and he should be recognized for his sterling service as a law enforcement officer; now, therefore,
