A RESOLUTION to honor the memory of Patricia Ann "Trisha" Hutchins Brown of Gallatin.

WHEREAS, the members of this General Assembly were greatly saddened to learn of the passing of Patricia Ann "Trisha" Hutchins Brown; and

WHEREAS, Trisha Brown was an exemplary and conscientious public servant and consummate professional who worked assiduously to improve the quality of life for her fellow citizens; and

WHEREAS, born on September 1, 1942, in Atlanta, Georgia, Mrs. Brown was raised in Jacksonville, Florida, where she attended Landon High School; she attended both Queen College in Charlotte, North Carolina, and the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, from which she received her Bachelor of Science degree in Education, and later earned her master's degree from Trevecca Nazarene College; and

WHEREAS, always a strong proponent of education, Trisha Brown loved teaching and serving as principal; during her three-decade career in education, she taught art, history, civics, and government at Gallatin High School and Gallatin Junior High School and worked with students at E.B. Wilson High School who could not earn their high school diploma through a traditional path; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Brown was elected to serve on the Sumner County School Board in 2014 and had recently begun her third term representing the 9th District; she also served on the board of Friends of the Gallatin Public Library; and

WHEREAS, she was also wholly devoted to her family and always endeavored to remain true to family values of the highest order; and

WHEREAS, left to mourn her memory are her husband of nearly sixty years, Paul Kendrick "Kenny" Brown; her brother, Paul (Leslie) Hutchins; her sister, Pamela Hutchins; her daughter, Paige Brown (Adam Clark); her son, Phillip (Sharron) Brown; and her grandchildren, Trey Brown, Mary Katherine Brown, Jake Wooten, and Chris (Amy) Reichle; and

WHEREAS, she is further survived by her great-grandson, Jax Reichle; her bonus grandchildren, Morris (Rachel) Holleman, Lana (Kyle) Mullins, and Kristen (Josh) Stanton; her bonus great-grandchildren, Hayden Holleman, Harper Dean Holleman, Lindyn Lee, Hutch Mullins, Jackston Mullins, Hank Mullins, and McKinley Chessor; and many nieces and nephews; and
