A RESOLUTION to honor Boy Scout Troop 94 on its seventy-fifth anniversary.

WHEREAS, at a time when this nation's youth face difficult challenges, the Boy Scouts of America is one of our finest assets, providing young people with an educational program that contributes significantly to their character development, citizenship training, and improved mental and physical fitness; and

WHEREAS, Boy Scout Troop 94 has played a pivotal role in the accomplishment of the Boy Scouts of America's lofty goals for many years, and this year it celebrates its seventy-fifth anniversary; and

WHEREAS, chartered in 1948, Troop 94 is sponsored by Asbury United Methodist Church and serves the communities of Greeneville and Greene County; Troop 94 is one of the oldest and most successful troops in the Sequoyah Council, which comprises southwest Virginia and northeast Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, throughout its seven and one-half decades, Troop 94 has provided many young people with a strong foundation in their formative years, molding them into upstanding citizens and positive contributors to our great nation; and

WHEREAS, each year, the Scouts and leaders of Troop 94 provide more than 500 hours of volunteer community service, participating in such projects as Scouting for Food, Eagle service projects, conservation programs, and flag decorations at the National Cemetery; as part of the American Flag Project, the troop has placed American flags along city streets on holidays for a number of years; and


