## **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 167**

A RESOLUTION to confirm the appointment of Caroline Ezell McAnally to the advisory board for the University of Tennessee Southern.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-9-501, established advisory boards for the University of Tennessee, Knoxville; University of Tennessee at Martin; University of Tennessee at Chattanooga; University of Tennessee Health Science Center; and University of Tennessee Southern; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-9-501, provides that the governor shall appoint five members to each advisory board; and

WHEREAS, Governor Bill Lee has appointed Caroline Ezell McAnally to serve as a member of the advisory board for the University of Tennessee Southern for a term that expires on June 30, 2024; and

WHEREAS, a highly successful businesswoman, Caroline McAnally currently works as a plant controller at Modine Manufacturing Company, Lawrence County's largest employer, where she oversees accounting personnel and prepares the annual budget; and

WHEREAS, she is a 2014 graduate of Martin Methodist College and was a 2021 member of Leadership Lawrence County; and


WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-9-501, provides that each member appointed by the governor to the advisory board for the University of Tennessee Southern shall be confirmed by the general assembly; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRTEENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, that we hereby confirm the appointment of Caroline Ezell McAnally to the advisory board for the University of Tennessee Southern for a term that expires on June 30, 2024.
