**EXECUTIVE ORDER**  
BY THE GOVERNOR

**AN ORDER ENDING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY THAT WAS DECLARED AS A RESULT  
OF THE FLOODING IN EAST TENNESSEE ON AUGUST 5, 2012**

**WHEREAS**, on August 5, 2012, high winds, heavy rain, and flooding occurred and resulted in a state of emergency due to conditions in several East Tennessee counties, including Washington and adjacent counties; and

**WHEREAS**, this severe weather resulted in an effective response and recovery; and

**WHEREAS**, emergency personnel have continued to support recovery after the impact of this severe weather, and since the storms have passed, flooding has diminished and emergency management activities have become more administrative in nature.

**NOW THEREFORE**, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Tennessee Constitution and other applicable law, including but not limited to Tennessee Code Annotated Section 58-2-107(b), do hereby terminate the state of emergency created by this event.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have subscribed my signature and caused the Great Seal of the State of Tennessee to be affixed this 18<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2012.
