

PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, between July of 1989 and June of 1998, Kevin Campbell was convicted in the General Sessions Court of Hamilton County, Tennessee, of passing a worthless check (case nos. 473543, 565567, 575884, 575885, 575886) and in the Criminal Court of Hamilton County, Tennessee, of passing a worthless check (case no. 179317); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency for the following reasons:

Mr. Campbell is active in his community, including leading an annual barbecue fundraiser with his church to provide coats to underprivileged children. Mr. Campbell has served the people of Bradley County and Tennessee in various roles in law enforcement. Mr. Campbell is supported by his family, friends, and colleagues. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended granting a pardon to Mr. Campbell.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Kevin Campbell, pardoning him for his 1989 through 1998 convictions listed above.
