

## COMMUTATION

## TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, in February of 2019, in the Criminal Court for Henderson County, Tennessee, Jerry Hall (TOMIS #604085) was convicted of four counts of possessing methamphetamine with intent to sell in a school zone (case no. 18-217-3). He received an eight-year sentence, including a sentence enhancement for the violation of Tennessee's drug-free school zone statute, Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-17-432; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to commute sentences; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive elemency for the following reasons:

After Mr. Hall's commission of the offenses, the Tennessee General Assembly amended the drug-free school zone statute by changing the circumstances in which enhanced sentencing may apply. The circumstances of Mr. Hall's offenses do not appear to warrant enhanced sentencing under the drug-free school zone statute as amended.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby commute the sentence imposed upon Mr. Jerry Hall for his convictions of possessing methamphetamine with intent to sell in a school zone to make him eligible for parole consideration by the Tennessee Board of Parole. Mr. Hall shall live the life of a good citizen and shall not violate any of the laws of the United States, the State of Tennessee, or any other state and shall not be guilty of conduct which is illegal or improper in the opinion of the governor.
