**PARDON**

**TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:**

**WHEREAS**, in July of 2001, in the Criminal Court of Rutherford County, Tennessee, Jason Moore was convicted of one count of prescription fraud (case no. F49466); and


**WHEREAS**, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

**WHEREAS**, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency for the following reasons:

Mr. Moore graduated from an extensive drug treatment program and has been clean nearly twenty years. He is active in his church and in his community. Mr. Moore has been steadily employed the past fifteen years in a management role with a construction company. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended granting a pardon to Mr. Moore.

**NOW THEREFORE**, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Jason Moore, pardoning him for his 2001 conviction of prescription fraud.
