

PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, between August of 1998 and April of 2005, Christopher Park was convicted of one count of trespass in the General Sessions Court of Davidson County, Tennessee (case no. 285783); one count of possession of drug paraphernalia in the General Sessions Court of Davidson County, Tennessee (case no. 285784); one count of unlawful drug possession without a prescription in the General Sessions Court of Davidson County, Tennessee (case no. GS178815); one count of possession of cocaine with intent to sell and one count of simple possession in the Criminal Court of Sumner County, Tennessee (case no. 930-2000); and one count of possession of drug paraphernalia and one count of failure to appear in the General Sessions Court of Wilson County, Tennessee (case no. 082783); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency for the following reasons:

Since his offenses, Mr. Christopher Park has shown a remarkable transformation. He has obtained his bachelor's degree with highest honors and has successfully completed numerous state insurance examinations. Witnesses testified to his trustworthiness and reliability. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended granting a pardon to Mr. Park.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Christopher Park, pardoning him for his 1998 through 2005 convictions listed above.
