

PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, in February of 1980, in the Criminal Court for Crockett County, Tennessee, Randy Pool was convicted of five counts of grand larceny (case nos. 1558-1562), one count of petit larceny (case no. 1563), and one count of larceny and receiving and concealing stolen property (case no. 1564); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive elemency for the following reasons:

Mr. Pool has had forty years of exemplary citizenship. He has maintained employment for over thirty-seven years with the same company. He is active in his church, which he has attended over a decade, and where he serves with the Christmas toy drive and Sunday services. He publicly acknowledges his past wrongdoing and teaches others about avoiding crimes. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended granting a pardon to Mr. Pool.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Randy Pool, pardoning him for his 1980 convictions of grand larceny, petit larceny, and larceny and receiving and concealing stolen property.
