TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

**WHEREAS**, in July of 2007, Brendan Sullivan was convicted of driving under the influence in the General Sessions Court of Blount County, Tennessee (case no. 50074549); and


**WHEREAS**, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

**WHEREAS**, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency for the following reasons:

Since the offense, Mr. Brendan Sullivan has successfully obtained his master's and law degrees. In his practice of law, he works primarily as a legal aid attorney. Mr. Sullivan is supported by his community, co-workers, and law clients. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended granting a pardon to Mr. Sullivan.

**NOW THEREFORE**, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Brendan Sullivan, pardoning him for his 2007 conviction.
