PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, in April of 2011, in the Criminal Court for Knox County, Tennessee, Tylor Trotter was convicted of one count of robbery (case no. 97117); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency for the following reasons:

After committing this offense, Mr. Trotter entered recovery, and he now runs a barbershop where he ministers to those in need. Mr. Trotter offers haircuts free of charge on what he calls "Ministry Monday" to clients who "need an ear" while they have their hair cut. Mr. Trotter is involved in recovery programs and has been recognized and commended as a positive influence in his community. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended granting a pardon to Mr. Trotter.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Tylor Trotter, pardoning him for his 2011 conviction listed above.
