In Re: Proposed Rule amendments Chapter 0080-06-24 Pest Plant Regulations Filed February 23, 2007; effective June 28, 2007 March 2007 TAR FS 02-26-07 DBID 2385

Come now the Petitioners, Tennessee Nursery and Landscape Association, Inc., pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. §4-5-202, and request a hearing on the proposed rules of the Regulatory Services Division, Department of Agriculture submitted as follows:

The text of the proposed amendments is as follows:

## Amendments

Chapter 0080-06-24 Pest Plant Regulations is amended by deleting the rule in its entirety and substituting the following language so that, as amended, the rule shall read:

0080-06-24-.01 Definitions. Pest plants: Plant species, and parts thereof that might be used for propagation, which are injurious to the agricultural, horticultural, silvicultural, or other interests of the state.

Authority: Tenn. Code Ann. §43-06-104.

0080-06-24-.02 Pest Plant List. The following plants are to be considered pest plants:

- (1) Lythrum salicaria, Lythrum virgatum and related cultivars, Purple Loosestrife
- (2) Solanum viarum, Tropical Soda Apple
- (3) Ligustrum sinense, Chinese privet
- (4) Ligustrum vulgare, Common privet, European Privet
- (5) Iperata cylindrica, Cogongrass
- (6) Lonicera maackii, Shrub honeysuckle, Amur honeysuckle
- (7) Lonicera morrowii, Morrows bush honeysuckle, Morrow's honeysuckle
- (8) Lonicera x bella, Bell's honevsuckle
- (9) Albizia julibrissin, Mimosa
- (10) Rosa multiflora, Multiflora rose
- (11) Eleagnus umbellata, Autumn olive
- (12) Eleagnus pungens, Thorny olive
- (13) Salvinia molesta, Giant Salvinia
- (14) Commelina benghalensis, Tropical Spiderwort

Authority: T.C.A. §§43-06-104 and 43-06-106.

- 1. The Petitioners, Tennessee Nursery and Landscape Association, Inc. (TNLA) meet the statutory criteria of associations that have standing to petition for a hearing on this matter.
- 2. TNLA is a Tennessee not-for-profit organization with members from all aspects of the green industry including wholesale nursery producers, retail garden centers, landscape contractors,
