

Emergency Rules
of the
Tennessee Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission – 1110

Chapter 1110-2
Certification

Pursuant to T.C.A. § 4-5-208, I am promulgating emergency rules amending the grounds under which the Tennessee peace officer standards and training commission can initiate proceedings to suspend or revoke POST certifications.

I have made a finding that there is an emergency creating a danger to the public welfare in that the existing rules provide a loophole, allowing an officer who is allowed to resign in lieu of termination to avoid any disciplinary action with regard to the officer's POST certification. In a case where an officer avoids termination or long-term suspension by submitting a resignation, there are not sufficient grounds to allow the commission to initiate the necessary proceedings to make a determination as to the professional competence of an officer. This lack of enforceability constitutes a danger to the health, safety and welfare of the public.

Amendments

Part (2)(a)(3) of rule 1110-2-.04 Denial, Suspension, and Revocation of Certification is amended by adding text to part (3) so that, as amended, the part shall read:

- (3) Be suspended for thirty (30) days or longer, resign in lieu of termination, or be discharged by his employing law enforcement agency for disciplinary reasons; or
