Rule Number 0080-05-16-.01 Dicamba is added as a new rule and shall read:

CHAPTER 0080-05-16 AGRICULTURAL PESTICIDES

0080-05-16-.01 DICAMBA.

- (1) Dicamba is any pesticide containing 3, 6-Dichloro-2-methoxybenzoic acid or 3, 6- Dichloro-o-anisic acid.
- (2) If a pesticide is labeled to have a dicamba concentration of at least 6.5% weigh/weight and is not labeled for over-the-top use, a person shall not apply the pesticide between May 15 and October 1 of the same year for production of cotton or soybeans, including for pre-plant purposes.
- (3) Violations.
 - (a) Where dicamba of any concentration is applied in violation of the Act, its corresponding regulations, or this rule, each acre of the application shall be a separate violation.
 - (b) A person is responsible for violations when committed by either the person or his agent.
 - (c) Each violation is grounds for denial or revocation of any pesticide certificate, license, or charter issued by the department; actions for injunction; and assessment of civil penalties.

Public Hearing Comments

The Department of Agriculture held a public hearing on June 23, 2022. Jay Miller served as hearing officer for the Rulemaking Hearing concerning 0080-05-16-.01 Dicamba. No questions or comments on the rule were presented from the public during the hearing.

Regulatory Flexibility Addendum

Pursuant to T.C.A. §§ 4-5-401 through 4-5-404, prior to initiating the rule making process, all agencies shall conduct a review of whether a proposed rule or rule affects small business.

(1) Type or types of small business subject to the proposed rule that would bear the cost of and/or directly benefit from the proposed rule:

Pesticide applicators who serve producers of cotton and soybeans will be subject to this proposed rule. The Department anticipates these applicators will not bear additional costs or benefits associated with the rule.

(2) Identification and estimate of the number of small businesses subject to the proposed rule:

There are approximately 7,000 private applicators and 272 commercial applicators in Tennessee. However, not all private or commercial applicators use dicamba products.

(3) Projected reporting, recordkeeping and other administrative costs required for compliance with the proposed rule, including the type of professional skills necessary for preparation of the report or record:

The rule does not change recordkeeping or other administrative costs already associated with application of pesticides.

(4) Statement of the probable effect on impacted small businesses and consumers:

Impacted small businesses and consumers will limit generic dicamba use to non-restricted times of the year either by using restricted dicamba products only before May 15 or after October 1, or by using non-restricted products throughout the year. Given the accessibility to continue use of generic dicamba and wide availability of other alternative products, the Department anticipates effects of this rule to be minimal on small businesses and consumers, while also protecting against vaporization of generic dicamba during hot weather months.

(5) Description of any less burdensome, less intrusive or less costly alternative methods of achieving the purpose and/or objectives of the proposed rule that may exist, and to what extent such alternative means might be less burdensome to small business:

The rule is tailored in the least burdensome manner possible to small business.

(6) Comparison of the proposed rule with any federal or state counterparts:

These rules are consistent with the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved label for this product and the EPA's recommended use of the product. The rule is consistent with the Department's authority under Tenn. Code Ann. § 62-21-118.

(7) Analysis of the effect of the possible exemption of small businesses from all or any part of the requirements contained in the proposed rule.

The rule is tailored in the least burdensome manner possible, and further exemption from the rule may undo its intended protection against vaporization of generic dicamba products during hot weather months.

Impact on Local Governments

This proposed rule is being promulgated to reinstitute annual restrictions on application of generic dicamba products to cotton or soybeans from May 15 to October 1. Tennessee had a similar rule in place from 2018 until 2021 when it was repealed as part of a larger rulemaking package for pesticides programs at the Department.

(B) A citation to and brief description of any federal law or regulation or any state law or regulation mandating promulgation of such rule or establishing guidelines relevant thereto;

T.C.A. § 62-21-101, et seq. regulates the application of pesticides in Tennessee.

Private applicators and cotton and soybean producers are most directly affected by this proposed rule.

Terminix Intern. Co., LP v. Tennessee Dept. of Labor, 77 S.W.3d 185 (Tenn. Ct. App. 2001) (State jurisdiction to regulate sale or use of pesticides is not preempted by federal authority). No other state law opinions, attorney general opinions, or sixth circuit opinions have been identified.
