Public Hearing Comments

Regulatory Flexibility Addendum

Pursuant to T.C.A. §§ 4-5-401 through 4-5-404, prior to initiating the rule making process, all agencies shall conduct a review of whether a proposed rule or rule affects small business.

(1) The type or types of small business and an identification and estimate of the number of small businesses subject to the rule being proposed that would bear the cost of, or directly benefit from the rule being proposed;

There are currently just over 300 permitted taxidermists in Tennessee. The proposed rule amendment will require taxidermists to maintain one additional piece of information for recordkeeping purposes. Most of the permitted taxidermists already use forms provided by the TWRA, and the information required by this proposed rule amendment is on the TWRA-provided form.

(2) The projected reporting, recordkeeping and other administrative costs required for compliance with the rule being proposed, including the type of professional skills necessary for preparation of the report or record;

The projected recordkeeping required for compliance will be minimal, as it is understood that most taxidermists already record both TWRA Identification Numbers and check-in confirmation numbers as a matter of course. No other additional costs are expected.

(3) A statement of the probable effect on impacted small businesses and consumers;

It is estimated that there will be no effect to small business and consumers.

(4) A description of any less burdensome, less intrusive or less costly alternative methods of achieving the purpose and objectives of the rule being proposed that may exist, and to what extent the alternative means might be less burdensome to small business;

This is the least burdensome method the TFWC could establish to achieve the purpose and objectives of the rule amendment being proposed. Moreover, most taxidermists already collect the information at issue.

(5) A comparison of the rule being proposed with any federal or state counterparts; and

There are no federal or state counterparts to this proposed rule amendment with direct comparisons.

(6) Analysis of the effect of the possible exemption of small businesses from all or any part of the requirements contained in the rule being proposed.

Most taxidermists already collect the information at issue. Given this is a best practice and, the effect upon the taxidermist is minimal, any exemption would lead to inconsistent application.

Impact on Local Governments

Pursuant to T.C.A. §§ 4-5-220 and 4-5-228, "On any rule and regulation proposed to be promulgated, the proposing agency shall state in a simple declarative sentence, without additional comments on the merits or the policy of the rule or regulation, whether the rule or regulation may have a projected financial impact on local governments. The statement shall describe the financial impact in terms of increase in expenditures or decrease in revenues."

The proposed rule amendment is not anticipated to have any projected financial impact on local governments.

Additional Information Required by Joint Government Operations Committee

(A) A brief summary of the rule and a description of all relevant changes in previous regulations effectuated by such rule;

The proposed rule amendment changes the word "or" to "and" in Rule 1660-01-10-.01(1)(f). The information requested in subparagraph (f) is readily available when carrying a game harvest to a taxidermist. Requiring both pieces of information will assist wildlife officers in verifying and matching game harvests to the hunter to the records of the harvest report made by the hunter. This would ensure proper harvest data is kept for reporting and managing the State's wildlife. Most of the permitted taxidermists already use forms provided by the TWRA, and the information required by this proposed rule amendment is on the TWRA-provided form.

(B) A citation to and brief description of any federal law or regulation or any state law or regulation mandating promulgation of such rule or establishing guidelines relevant thereto;

Tennessee Code Annotated § 70-2-215(a) requires a taxidermist to obtain a permit to engage in the practice of taxidermy. Tennessee Code Annotated § 70-2-215(c) requires such permit to be "... in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the commission..."

Federal law and regulation defer to the state on this matter except in cases of migratory birds. 50 C.F.R. § 21.63(a) provides that "... A taxidermist permit is required before any person may perform taxidermy services on migratory birds or their parts, nests, or eggs for any person other than himself."

(C) Identification of persons, organizations, corporations or governmental entities most directly affected by this rule, and whether those persons, organizations, corporations or governmental entities urge adoption or rejection of this rule;

Persons or entities most affected by this rule will be permitted taxidermists and the State's hunters when carrying a game harvest to a taxidermist. No persons or entities affected by this proposed rule amendment submitted public comment or engaged with the TFWC on the matter.

(D) Identification of any opinions of the attorney general and reporter or any judicial ruling that directly relates to the rule or the necessity to promulgate the rule;

There are no Attorney General Opinions nor judicial rulings that the Agency is aware of on point with the rule amendment contemplated herein.

(E) An estimate of the probable increase or decrease in state and local government revenues and expenditures, if any, resulting from the promulgation of this rule, and assumptions and reasoning upon which the estimate is based. An agency shall not state that the fiscal impact is minimal if the fiscal impact is more than two percent (2%) of the agency's annual budget or five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), whichever is less;

Promulgation of this rule will not result in an increase or decrease in state and local revenues and expenditures.

CHAPTER 1660-01-10 RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING BUSINESS OF TAXIDERMY

1660-01-10-.01 Records

1660-01-10-.02 General

1660-01-10-.01 RECORDS.

- (1) All taxidermists are required to maintain complete and accurate records on TWRA taxidermy forms on all birds, animals and/or fish, or parts thereof, they receive. All Taxidermy forms shall be completed, maintained and stored in accordance with the TWRA Taxidermy Form Instruction sheet located on the TWRA web site. The records shall include:
 - (a) The species of bird, animal and/or fish mounted.
 - (b) The complete name and address of the person from whom received.
 - (c) The complete name and address of the person who killed or took the species (if different from the first).
 - (d) The date killed or taken.
 - (e) The state, county, and/or country where taken.
 - (f) The TWRA Identification Number of and the confirmation number from a completed check-in for all big game animals taken in Tennessee and submitted for mounting.
 - (g) The service fee for the preparation of the animal.
 - (h) The record shall reflect if the animal came from a shooting preserve, road kill, salvage, or other.
- (2) All records as prescribed in paragraph (1) above shall be maintained on the Taxidermy Accountability Form and shall be held at the taxidermist's place of business. They shall be open to inspection by any duly constituted officer of the Wildlife Resources Agency at all reasonable times. Said records must be maintained for a period of three (3) years.
- (3) All Taxidermy Accountability Forms and the Log of Taxidermy Accountability Forms shall be kept, maintained and secured together, in one location, and in sequential order. The Log of Taxidermy Accountability Forms shall consist of the following:
 - (a) Complete Name
 - (b) Control Number
 - 1. Control numbers shall begin with the current year followed by consecutive numbering beginning with the number one (1).
 - 2. Control numbers shall be affixed to all trophies and their parts while in possession of the taxidermist.
- (4) All records shall be recorded in non-erasable ink.
